BLACK OUT

Act II, Scene 3

Lights come up full on Hannah & Gordon's house. Nettie enters and cleans up a bit. She goes off and comes back on with two candle sticks. She puts them down on the table behind the couch and lights them. She exits. Hannah walks in on her own dressed nicely for Shabat. She crosses center and does a couple of knee bends. She smiles. The DOORBELL rings. Nettie enters and goes to the door. As she opens it Gordon enters from stage RIGHT. The KIDS enter dressed for Shabat kissing the mezuzah without being told. SAM & JILL enter dressed for Shabat. Jill kisses the mezuzah looks at SAM who does the same. The family all ad-lib greetings and hugs.

(When GORDON SHAKES HANDS with SAM START MUSIC)

THE CAST sings:
